### Section 1

**Summary:** Genesis means “beginning”. It is the first book of the Bible, most likely written by Moses as dictated by God. It covers Creation (1-2), The Fall of mankind (3), the Flood (6-8), and the story of Abraham’s family.

### Section 2

**Summary:** Exodus takes place about 400 years after Abraham. It is the account of the life of Moses, a descendant of Jacob (Abraham’s grandson), and how God called him to deliver the Israelites (descendants of Abraham) out of slavery in Egypt to a Promised Land in Canaan (modern day Israel). Deuteronomy takes place about 40 years after the Exodus from Egypt. In it Moses recounts the history of God’s people in order to prepare them to go into the Promised Land. Both books were most likely written by Moses.

### Section 3

**Summary:** Matthew is a biography of the life of Jesus, written by one of his disciples named Matthew (also known as Levi). Acts is an account of the birth of the early Church directly following the resurrection of Jesus. It was written by Luke, a follower of Jesus (who also wrote the Gospel book of Luke). In chapter 9 of Acts, a young man named Saul (also known as Paul) is dramatically converted from an enemy of Christians to a follower of Jesus. He went on to write most of the New Testament, including Ephesians, which is a letter to the church in the city of Ephesus (in modern day Turkey).
